REMEMBERING THOSE WHO HUNGER

Lent is an especially appropriate time to remember the hungry, as we recall the time Jesus spent in the wilderness and perhaps participate in the traditional discipline of fasting. It is also a great time to take advantage of the MN Food Share program and support our local food shelf. Once again, the youth will lead our efforts as a congregation. The food shelf is

more important than ever: food prices continue to rise as do the needs of our community. This year, our goal is to raise \$10,000. Checks can be made to Bethel Lutheran with "March Food Drive" in the memo and dropped of at church or placed in the offering on Sunday morning.

Hunger is also global, and this year, our Stewardship and Mission & Justice Committees have chosen **ELCA World Hunger** as the recipient of our Easter offering. This amazing arm of the ELCA works in 60 countries including the United States to alleviate hunger and pro-actively deal with agriculture, nutrition, clean water, sanitation, health care, disease prevention, savings groups and education. This year the ELCA celebrates 50 years of addressing the root causes of hunger and poverty around the world. Because the program is under the ELCA umbrella, remarkably only 8% of donations are used for administration. As a partner in this world-wide ministry, Bethel has been a faithful donor to ELCA World Hunger for many years.

This year, Bethel is joining our SE MN Synod and the ELCA Church-wide to give even more emphasis to ELCA World Hunger, and we hope our congregation is generous as we share in this celebration of 50 years of life-saving work. A more detailed letter will be mailed to all members in early March with a return envelope for your gift. Let's be especially generous this anniversary year as we reach out, through ELCA World Hunger, to our siblings in need around the globe.

March is typically the month we begin transitioning from winter into spring here in Minnesota. But these past months have felt like we've been transitioning into spring all winter long. And as the season of winter has been odd for us these past months, the same could be said for our recent seasons in the church year. The 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas Eve fell on the same day, Ash Wednesday fell on Valentine's Day, and Holy Week and Easter will be early, falling on the last week and day of this month (which will also be Spring Break for Northfield schools).

Amidst all this oddity, I find it can be hard to feel settled, to stop and reflect on what I and we want and need out of this church season we are in. Intention can be hard, but I never really regret trying to be intentional about where and with what I am investing my time, energy, and resources. I find this intention especially valuable as we approach Holy Week at the end of this month. It takes intention to commit to and experience the journey of Holy Week, to discipline ourselves to participate in worship on days and times that are abnormal, and to spiritually traverse the mountaintop and deep valley emotional experiences the scriptures take us through.

In these last weeks of Lent, may we give ourselves space to acknowledge and feel the oddities and challenges of this season, may we intentionally prepare ourselves for the coming Holiest of Weeks in the church year, and may we remember that we are resurrection people and aspire to continuously rise to new life in countless ways.

"Why are you downcast, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me?" despairs the Psalmist in chapter 42 verse 11. A Minnesota winter filled with endless cloudy days might leave one feeling sad and depressed. When focusing on the negative, on what's hard or unfair or distressing, we can be easily overwhelmed. In America, where approximately one in ten people experience depression at any one time, you might be feeling dejected, gloomy, despondent, broken hearted, miserable, wretched, grief-stricken, crushed or depressed.

There are support groups to join, websites with podcasts devoted to specific issues, and online support available. Locally there are groups willing to listen and help. Among them are:

The **FaceItFoundation.org** which empowers men to recover from depression. Dan Foley runs a group that meets Tuesdays twice a month at Bethel.

The **NamiMN.org** group provides support and advocacy for adults with mental illness. Led by Kent, a group meets at St John's Lutheran Church every Friday.

Hosanna Lutheran in Dundas hosts GriefShare.org self-contained sessions on Thursdays.

Beginning March 18th, a grief support group called "Facing the Mourning" will meet for four Mondays at the Allina Health Clinic located in the Lower-Level Education Room from 4-5:30 pm. Please contact Brenda Jirik at Brenda.Jirik@Allina.com or call 507-977-2856 for details. This interactive support group for friends and family addresses all types of death and lengths of grieving. Participant Manual cost is \$20.

While BeFriender ministers are not trained therapists, they are trained to listen without judgment, all the while recognizing that most people can resolve their issues on their own. 

PALM SUNDAY PANCAKE BREAKFAST


