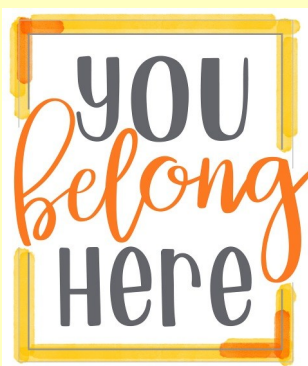

Dear Bethel,

The “tide” of Eastertide, Merriam-Webster tells me, comes from the Old English *tīd*, meaning time, period, era. Still, I love the association with an incoming ocean tide: the ongoing movement, the waves coming up the shore a little farther each time: I think about God’s love relentlessly rolling in. I like the togetherness: “a rising tide lifts all ships,” - so different from the winner-loser language of the newspaper headlines today.

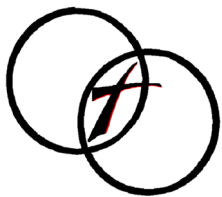
In this busy and battered world, I need Easter to keep coming – to wash over me again, to wake me up, to restore my wonder and will when they are flagging. So I am grateful for this season of 50 days, and I am grateful that throughout the year, every Sunday is a mini-Easter, celebrating the resurrection. However, Eastertide is not escape from the challenges of life. I am excited for how the Narrative Lectionary will move us quickly into Acts and the Letters of Paul. After all, none of the gospel accounts give much detail after the resurrection accounts: Matthew and Mark give a few verses (if any); Luke and John offer a half a chapter. God’s word urges us on: the early church plunged into figuring out what faith in the risen Christ looked like, just as we do in our context.

At the World Youth Day in 2023, Pope Francis gave these words of encouragement: “I want to tell you: carry on, keep riding the waves of love, of charity. Be ‘surfers’ of love!” May we help each other catch the waves this Eastertide, and carry God’s love to those who need it most.

BEFRIENDERS

Bethel has had a BeFriender ministry for over 25 years. During this time dozens of Bethel members have completed a 20-hour training based on the ministry’s foundation principles: God is present, caring not curing, nonjudgmental presence, and active listening. This year, we commissioned five newly trained BeFrienders alongside eleven other active BeFrienders available to serve. The BeFriender logo shows a cross in the middle of two intersecting circles, reminding us that God is present when BeFrienders visit their listening partner and a sacred space is created between them.

The purpose of pastoral care and the BeFriender ministry is not to “fix” people. Rather, supported by the BeFriender’s listening without judgement and with extreme confidentiality, the listening partner finds their own path in their own time. One-to-one matches make it possible for assigned ministers to spend significant time and develop deep trust with their listening partners. This individualized care provides higher support than the pastors can provide with their visits.






Both the BeFriender and the listening partner grow and are changed by their relationship. Active BeFrienders attend monthly meetings to support and learn from each other. Confidentiality is maintained: matches are never shared with the group, and any names are changed to “Mary” and “Joseph” when necessary.

“Be” Friending is not “Do” Friending. There is no need for BeFrienders to do anything. Spending time with another by offering a listening presence is enough. Listening partners are allowed to share their joys and sorrows without fear of interruption or disapproval. Listening to the same story over and over is allowed. Held in a form of love called listening, a heart heals in its own time and way.

May 4 — Indigenous Women: Messages of Healing and Justice

Rev. Dr. Kelly Sherman-Conroy will be with us once again, preaching and teaching, on the eve of the national recognition day for Missing & Murdered Indigenous Women. A member of the Oglala Sioux Tribe, Dr. Kelly is an Associate Pastor at All Nations Indian Church in Minneapolis. With her doctorate in Systematic Theology [Indigenous Theology] from Luther Seminary, she teaches as an Assistant Professor of Theology at St. Olaf College and an Adjunct Professor at Augsburg University. In addition, Dr. Kelly is a traveling theologian bringing teaching, messages of healing and justice, spiritual connection and advocacy for meaningful change to people nationally and internationally.

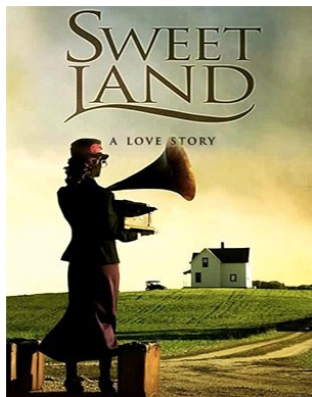


The MMIW Movement is one that advocates for an end to violence toward Indigenous women and seeks to raise awareness about the high rates of murders and disappearances of Indigenous peoples. Advocacy for the right to safety, accountability and justice through law enforcement is also a priority. 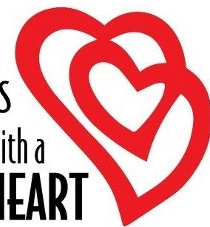

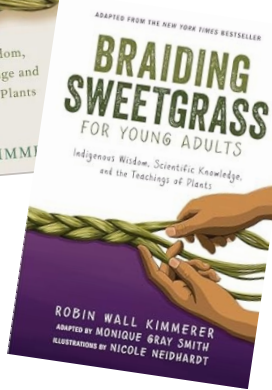
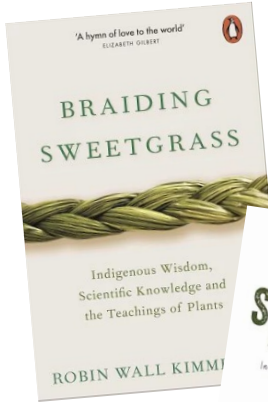

Braiding Sweetgrass



As a botanist, Robin Wall Kimmerer has been trained to ask questions of nature with the tools of science. As a member of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation, she embraces the notion that plants and animals are our oldest teachers.

In *Braiding Sweetgrass*, Kimmerer brings these lenses of knowledge together to show that awakening a wider ecological consciousness requires acknowledging and celebrating our reciprocal relationship with the rest of the living world. Only when we can hear the languages of other beings are we capable of understanding the earth's generosity, and learning to give our own gifts in return.

Bethel, you are amazing! Since the beginning of the year, we have finished raising the \$66,000 needed to improve the audio in the sanctuary and raised \$15,846 for the Northfield Food Shelf, plus donating to the Global Refuge fund through our Easter Offering. Thank you so much!

Now we need to turn our efforts to the operating budget. As of March 31, we were \$61,104 in deficit. This is an alarming amount and we must work together to get our revenue in balance. Yes, Bethel is fortunate to have an operating reserve that we can use in the short term, but it is your offerings that will cover our annual expenses. If we wait too long, it will be difficult if not impossible to catch-up. Your generosity is a blessing to Bethel.
