

# **PEACE** WITH CREATION **SEASON OF CREATION 2025**

Garden of Peace

The Lutheran World Federation's Season of Creation theme for 2025 Isaiah 32:14-18 is "Peace with Creation," drawing on Isaiah 32:14-18. Here at Bethel, we will focus on deserts, mountains, rivers, and flora.

On August 3, bring water from the ponds, rivers and lakes that have been part of your summer for a special Thanksgiving for Baptism. Throughout the month, you are encouraged to walk, bike or carpool as an act of worship on the way to worship (of course, no need to limit yourself to August if the Spirit so moves you)! We hope you feel the connection to and satisfaction of caring for God's world! Here are other action steps from our Creation Care team to consider this month...

#### **AUGUST 3: DESERTS**

From the Saguaro cactus to the cactus wren and the javelina, a desert ecosystem is uniquely beautiful. Advocate to protect deserts (especially that are part of our National Parks or public lands) from mining and housing development.



AUGUST 10: MOUNTAINS Mountains are more than picturesque; they are vital for our planet's well-being. Mountains are vital water towers, biodiversity hubs for plants and animals, and climate regulators. Replenish depleted forests, plant more trees and encourage conservation efforts. Grassroots efforts and policy level interventions are needed.

AUGUST 17: RIVERS Essential for the survival of many species, rivers provide drinking water, irrigation, transportation, recreation and more. Climate change, aging infrastructure and pollution are some of the biggest threats to rivers today. Work to reduce polluted runoff, volunteer with river and watershed protection organizations, and commit to reducing water consumption. Advocate for policies that protect water resources.

AUGUST 24: FLORA Flora, as the base of the food chain, is the backbone of all ecosystems. All animals, from insects to elephants (including humans), would not exist without the earth's vast diversity of flora. Flora (plants) regulate the climate, purify air and water, and prevent soil erosion. To take care of this pillar of God's creation, grow native plants in home gardens, landscaping, city parks and open spaces. Support policies that preserve native plant communities and that encourage, incentivize, and help fund the planting of native flora on public and private lands.

### **PASTORAL REFLECTIONS**

Last year, on the last Sunday of August, Bethel joined with St. John's and St. Peter's to offer the first "God's work. Our hands." Sunday here in Northfield. GWOH Sunday is a day of service for the ELCA. Historically, the Northfield ELCA congregations had not participated in this churchwide event because the default Sunday landed on Defeat of Jesse James Days. So, we opted to try for the last Sunday of August, and it was a great day of service. This year, the last Sunday of August (the 31st) lands on Labor Day Weekend, and both St. John's and St. Peter's are, understandably, unable to join with Bethel for this year. So, GWOH Sunday will be a solo Bethel event this time and we are dialing it back a bit in attempt to accommodate for Labor Day Weekend.

On August 31 the theme of "God's Work. Our Hands." will be present throughout both worship services, and there will be an onsite and offsite service opportunity in between.

Onsite from 9:30-10:30am, Rose Turnacliff will be leading TORCH Fall Care Package assembling, which will be distributed to Northfield TORCH college students this fall.

Offsite from 10-12pm, Bill Nelson will be leading a clean up of Bethel's new Adopt-A-Highway section. Much closer than our previous section, the section runs north along Eveleth Ave from the intersection with North Ave (right by Bethel) then runs west along County Road 96 until Foliage Ave. A fitting conclusion to our Season of Creation!

A small number of the yellow GWOH t-shirts will be available for purchase. If you received a t-shirt last year, make sure to wear it on the 31st.

#### **GARAGE SALE REVIEW!**

It's a wrap!! The 28th Bethel Garage Sale was a huge success. From the multitude of items donated by Bethel members, to the scores of volunteers who set-up, sorted, priced, baked and then worked at the two-day sale, this was an opportunity to experience the joy of community. Working together, supporting each other and getting to know one another better, were just a few ways the "community within" flourished.

From its inception, the Bethel Garage sale was intended to benefit our community by providing gently used, economically priced items, especially for families. This same principle guides the allocation of proceeds. This year the garage sale netted \$22,600.29. First, a tithe of \$2000 was donated to Bethel Lutheran for the operating budget. Next \$1000 was given to Bethel's Youth Camp scholarship fund, \$1250 to the quilting group for shipping and supplies, \$1250 for outdoor plant purchases, and \$200 to the AV fund to purchase equipment needed to convert the old wireless system into a portable system usable anywhere in the church. \$2500 was added to Bethel's Good Samaritan Fund for Aldi and Kwik Trip gift cards. \$50 was used for postage to send seashells to Florida for hermit crab homes. The CAC Food Shelf Diaper fund received \$2000, Northfield Health Finders \$2000, and \$7900 to Homes for God's Children. Finally, \$2000 was donated to the All-Seasons Community Services in Kenyon. They graciously accept our leftover donations and, despite losing the majority of their funding, their food shelf serves 5 communities. 140 leftover shoes were donated to "Good in the Hood."

This donation provided a week's worth of groceries for 140 people and got shoes on 120 people's feet.

The 2026 garage sale dates are May 15 &16. Setup and donation collection dates are May 10-13th. Volunteers who can lift and carry furniture are especially needed. Living into Bethel's values of "community within" and "community beyond", Bethel's garage sale event "shared Christ's love with a big heart."

#### Coming in September—A Shift in the Sunday Schedule
