The opening to a familiar Offertory Prayer, this line has always resonated strongly with me when I reflect on stewardship. Everything we, everything we are, and every opportunity given is a gift from God. There are many Biblical references comparing God's people to sheep. As a farmgirl, I've been around my share of sheep. Sheep are interesting creatures. They'll come running to the feed bunk when they hear the feed wagon coming, but they don't notice when the feed is dispensed on the opposite side of the pen. They clamor over each other until, finally, one of them figures it out. Sheep are rather defenseless; they don't have sharp teeth or claws. Sheep are safer if they stay together in a group. A sheep is most vulnerable when it is separated from the flock. It might be sick, lost, or just got out of the pen and can't figure out how to get back in. Without intervention, they could lose their way and become a coyote's next meal.

Like sheep, people generally don't thrive in isolation. Sometimes the pain and confusion following a move, change in relationship, loss, or an illness can make it easy to feel disconnected and withdraw from the community. It's difficult when you feel you're unnoticed. What a difference it makes when you're greeted with a smile and a listening ear.

As a "formal extension of the pastoral ministry of Bethel Lutheran Church," BeFriender ministers are trained listeners. Knowing that our pastors cannot make the number of visits to parishioners that they would like, BeFrienders are a valuable asset to our pastors. Monthly BeFriender meetings provide ongoing training and support.

Bethel strives to create and maintain community; a friendly greeter in the narthex, a handshake during the sharing of the peace, coffee fellowship between services, a visit from a pastor or a BeFriender. Any one of us can make a difference to someone feeling separated and alone.

FAITH FORMATION AT BETHEL...

WEDNESDAY

Limitless (3:30—5:45 pm)

Our after-school programming for elementary kids is underway! Buses bring children from school to Bethel at 3:30 pm. As everyone arrives and checks in, we play games and unwind before sharing a snack. At 4:10 pm, we have chapel, followed by a large group activity with Pastor Ben. At 4:45 pm, kids rotate between more age-specific activities. This fall, K-1st and 2-3rd graders are enjoying "Singing Shenanigans" with Abby Atzinger and games with Juley Jenkinson. 4-5th graders are rotating between chimes with Jill Mahr and faith conversations with Kristi Larson.

Kids' Options During Bistro (5:45-7 pm)

Our Bistro meal is for the whole family—and that includes fun spaces just for kids! While adults enjoy fellowship, children are welcome to stay with their parents in the CLC, or choose from the following:

- Nursery (Children Pre-K and younger) A safe and caring environment for our youngest ones.
- Art Room (Elementary Kids) A creative space to make the week's featured project or their own designs.
- Games & Activities in the Center Pod (Elementary Kids) A place for active play and large group games.

Please remember that the Youth Room is reserved for middle school and high school students.

6th Grade Connections, Confirmation & Hangtime (7 pm—8 pm)

6th Grade Connections, led by Scott Broughton (for the third year in a row!), meets every other week and helps youth prepare for confirmation.

7th—10th Grade Confirmation. This year, Kristi Larson is teaching 7th Grade, focusing on key Bible stories. Pastor Ben teaches 8th Grade, delving into the Lutheran understandings of the creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the sacraments. This year, veterans Peder Jothen and Doug Casson are back to help 9th Grade explore how we live out our faith. Ruth Hoekstra is shepherding our 10th graders reflect before they are confirmed on October 12.

Hangtime—youth fellowship—starts for all 11th and 12th graders on October 1st, Chad and Juley Jenkinson. 10th Graders join after they are confirmed. **Please thank all our volunteers for their work when you see them!**

Grief Group

Bethel is offering a six session extended retreat for people who are grieving the loss of a relative or friend. The mixed emotions, time constraints and extended family concerns during and after the death of a loved one make bereavement a difficult human experience. A person can also feel burdensome and lonely. Coming together, or retreating, with others who are experiencing similar losses can give relief, comfort, and healing.

The sessions will be held every other week in room 55 from 2:00 to 3:30 pm. The meeting dates are October 7 and 21, November 4 and 18, December 2 and 16. Pastor Phil Ruud and Barb Holm will be the group facilitators. The topics covered each session will be: 1) Telling your story 2) Emotions: Where do they start and end? 3) Dealing with Guilt, Shame and Anger 4) Rebuilding and Remembering 5) Finding Hope and Healing and 6) The Memorable joys of your loved one.

The group size will be limited to 12 participants and the registration deadline is Friday, October 3. Please call the church office to sign up. Participants can expect to have their stories and concerns held in confidentiality. All judgments will be set aside. Each person's experience will be received with warmth, support, and God's loving presence.

Monthly Movie

We will watch the second part of the classic film "It's a Wonderful Life" on Thursday, October 2, and continue our rich discussion of how the film connects to our own lives and the story of scripture.

Bethel Breast Friends










IN THE LIBRARY...

Some people spend their first year of retirement resting and helping their bodies heal and recover after

years of work. Others are exhausted in mind and spirit. In *Rest Is Resistance*, Hersey looks at our current Grind Culture and explores the connections to slave labor, capitalism, white supremacy, poverty, and exhaustion. Her research of Black history, and how her ancestors survived slavery, generational poverty, and exhaustion from working hard without ever getting ahead, inspired this book. Hersey's great-grandmother, a Jim Crow survivor, napped every day from 30 to 60 minutes and passed that habit down to her grandmother, Rhodi, and Grandmother Rhodie "napped" with a gun in her pocket while the Ku Klux Klan made its presence known in her neighborhood. Hersey is committed to not simply surviving, but to thriving without sacrificing her mind and body in the grind culture of today. Hersey says, "The time to rest is now."


